SOCIETY ACT

CONSTITUTION

1. The name of the Society is **COLLABORATIVE DIVORCE VANCOUVER** (“the Association”).
2. The purposes of the Society are:
 - a. To promote and develop the Collaborative Practice, as defined in the Society’s bylaws, as a method of transitioning couples and families through separation and divorce;
 - b. To further development of the ideas and principles of Collaborative Practice;
 - c. To promote awareness amongst the public at large about the Collaborative Practice and the Association itself;
 - d. To promote and provide professional development for the members of the Association;and such other complementary purposes not inconsistent with these purposes.
3. In the event of the winding up or dissolution of the Association, all funds and assets of the Association remaining after the payment or satisfaction of all expenses and liabilities of the Association, including remuneration, if any, of the liquidator, and after payment to employees of the Association of any salaries or wages owing, will be transferred to such organizations that are registered charities pursuant to the provisions of the *Income Tax Act* that will be designated by the members of the Association at the time of the winding up or dissolution of the Association and if effect cannot be given to said provisions, the funds will be transferred to such organizations that are determined by the members of the Association to be such registered charities which have a purpose similar to those of the Association.
4. The activities of the Association will be carried on without gain for its members, and any income, profits or accretions to the Association will be used in promoting the purposes of the Association.
5. No director or officer will be remunerated for being a director or officer, but a director or officer may be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred by him or her while engaged in the affairs of the Association.
6. Paragraphs 3, 4, 5 and 6 of this Constitution are unalterable in accordance with the *Society Act*.
